5.	<b>Wish Upon a Card</b>	<p><b>Volunteers.</b> Barbara needs workers for the Fiber Art Walk on July 5<sup>th</sup> from 1:00-6:00pm and at the Saturday sales on the 11<sup>th</sup> from 8:00am-5:00pm – rotating two people per shift for two hours. She also needs two people on Friday the 10<sup>th</sup> to take down and wrap up framed cards from the high school and transport to the Fiber Arts building.</p> <p><b>Framed postcards.</b> SOQS will hang the framed postcards at the entrance of Sisters Fiber Arts building. Ann Richardson indicated that more than the initial 50-60 cards were selected for framing.</p> <p><b>Set-up.</b> With limited space, the committee will sell unframed postcards out of baskets. There will be room for 1-2 tables, and the room where the wine was set up in 2008 may also be available. There was discussion of utilizing fabric-covered display boards.</p> <p><b>Take down.</b> Ann will need assistance with packing the framed postcards in bubble wrap and delivering them to the SOQS office.</p> <p><b>Leftover cards from Ann.</b> Ann gave Al a stack of fabric postcards that didn't make the cut for the professional framing. Some can be sold loose out of baskets, while others are suitable for simple framing with a recommended sales price of \$25 each.
